## FLIT3900 CANTA CHE TI PASSA (LAC FLIT/MUS)

### **Course Description:**

This course is offered in combination with MUSIC. Class will meet once a week to discuss Italian music, its meaning and role within Italian culture and the rest of the world. We will listen and analyze famous Italian operas and their libretti, folkloristic and pop/rock songs, while learning of important music events such as the annual Festival of Sanremo and its impact on the music market. SPECIAL FEATURES: AU Vocal Chamber Ensemble Spring Performance, Sanremo 2006 (27 Feb-4 Mar), audio and video recordings of operas and concerts, karaoke projects.

#### **Course Objectives:**

In this course students will increase their abilities to communicate in Italian within their professional field and will understand a variety of topics from a different perspective in order to be better prepared for the demands and opportunities of our global society. Students are expected to discuss social backgrounds; to understand the role and influence of music; to know the lives and achievements of notable Italian artists; and to appreciate the artistic guidelines of the time as dictated by the individual artists and by the cultural conditions.

## **Course Requirements:**

Due to the nature of the course, attendance is **required**. After four absences, regardless of the reason for the absence and of academic performance in the class, the student will receive an FA (Failure due to Excessive Absences). If students foresee regular conflicts with class attendance due to participation in official university sports activities, they must turn in, at the beginning of the term, a copy of the official calendar of events. Students are expected to do the assigned readings prior to class discussions. Students are also expected to write their own personal notes about the readings which will ONLY be collected the day of the discussion. Notes can be composed in English or Italian, prompted by the instructor's questions, according to the language fluency of the students. Students are required to have some Italian knowledge. Grades will be determined as follows:

Reading Notes 40%
Discussion Participation 40%
Final Mini-Presentation 20%

A schedule of class final mini-presentations will be available by the second week of class

#### **Special Accommodations:**
